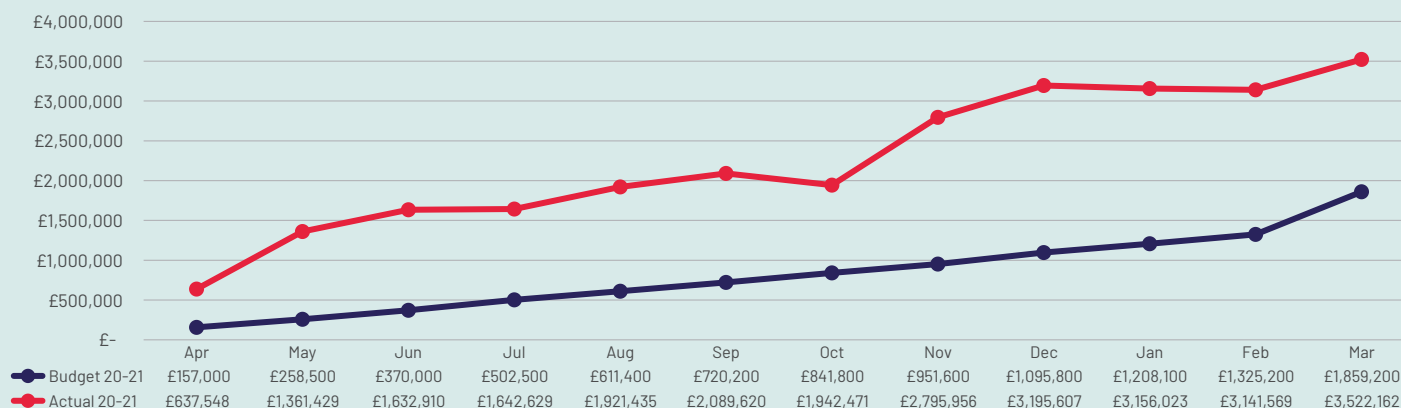

N&N Hospitals Charity Total Income 2020-21 Actual vs Budget

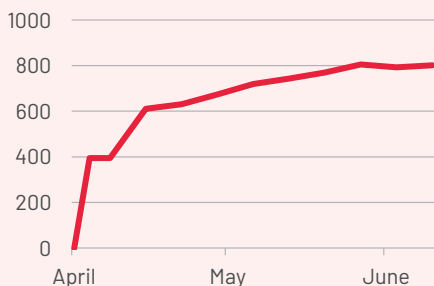


We are continually looking for opportunities to diversify our income streams. Below are a couple of examples:

N&N Hospitals Charity Lottery

From a standing start in April, as of June 2021 we had over 700 weekly entries to the Lottery draw. This is significantly ahead of expectations and our national lottery provider has explained that this positions us as “one of the top performing hospital charities”.

Lottery entries

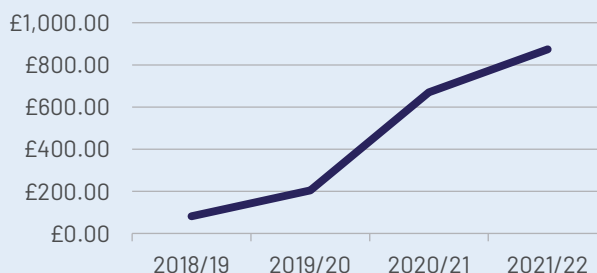


Amazon Smile

By registering to purchase via Amazon Smile, our supporters have helped to raise over £800 for the Charity.

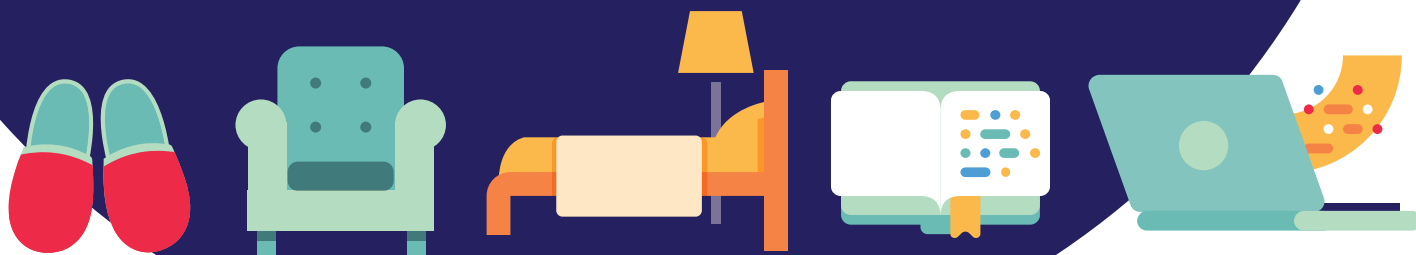
Amazon donates 0.5% of every purchase made via Amazon Smile to the buyer's chosen charity, and our quarterly income from this source has risen from £5 to £200 in the last three years.

The Norfolk & Norwich Hospitals Charity is registered with the Charity Commission (reg no 1048170). It works to enhance the care provided to patients of the Norfolk & Norwich University Hospitals through research, education, purchase of equipment, staff support and providing 'extras' that are not available through the NHS.

Recent Charity Grants:



The Charity has planned expenditure of almost £6m this year to support projects across the Trust. Some of the projects supported by the Charity are over £1m, whereas others are much more modest – but can have real impact. The following are a selection of recent grant awards:

£32,700

to purchase 6 transcutaneous CO2 monitors for NICU

£4,930

to purchase a body composite monitor for the Renal Unit

£655

for the Chaplains to purchase items for patients who arrive with no clothing

£1,800

to facilitate the Neonatal Voice Partnership for NICU

£507

to purchase slippers for patients who arrive without shoes

£9,407

for 45 members of staff to undertake additional training related to their role

£560

to purchase new electric chair scales for the Colney Centre

£2,230

to purchase new beds for NICU parents staying in McKee House

£5,694

to purchase an interactive display screen for training use in the Anaesthetic seminar room

£3,186

to fund a micropigmentation/tattoo training course for a Plastics Reconstruction team member

Thank you to everyone who has put forward suggestions and applications for future grants – these are being processed for inclusion in budget setting and fundraising plans for the next couple of years – as possible. Impact Reporting

Monitoring and reporting on the impact of Charity grant awards is a really important element of ensuring that donated funds are spent well and wisely. It is also key in encouraging future donations. All grant recipients are asked to provide evidence of impact – which is then used in our annual Impact Report and to help with future fundraising.

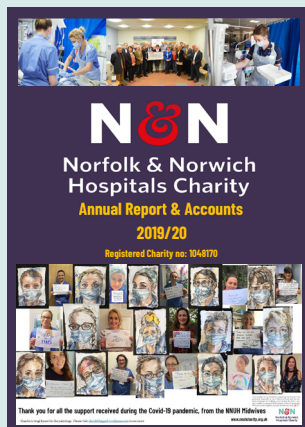
