


New IT equipment for Medical Illustration

The Charity was recently able to fund new IT equipment for the Medical Illustration Team. The Charity regularly asks for Ann and Justine's assistance on designing posters and leaflets, so we were really pleased to be able to help them in this way.

In case you aren't aware of what they do, their graphic design service offers design and artwork to NNUH staff, providing a full creative service which includes:

- Design for print—conference and event posters, banners, brochures, leaflets, flyers and cards
- Illustration—from infographics, logos, simple line drawings to detailed medical artwork for publication
- Print—management of both digital and litho printing.



The team work with users of the service to help develop their ideans and produce an end product that meets their needs whilst also ensuring that it conforms to Trust and NHS brand guidelines.

Recent Charity Grants:



The Charity has committed just under £7m to support projects across the Trust. Some of the projects supported by the Charity are over £1m, whereas others are much more modest – but can have real impact. The following are a selection of recent grant awards:
